Mamaweswen, THE NORTH SHORE TRIBAL COUNCIL invites applications for the position of a Registered Dietitian to work with our four (4) First Nation communities: Mississauga First Nation (outside of Blind River), Serpent River First Nation (Cutler), Sagamok Anishnawbek (Massey), and Atikameksheng Anishnawbek (Naughton). We are looking for an enthusiastic team player with a strong desire to work within our North Shore First Nation communities. Your skills as a Dietitian will be key in helping our community members to live in a good way.

Premium Employee Benefits include excellent professional development opportunities, up to 10 days paid professional development leave, professional fees paid annually up to \$1200, provision of company vehicle, company cell phone, a four-day service work week, with one day a week to collaborate with other multi-disciplinary team members and a supportive, friendly management team.

As a Registered Dietitian (RD) you will be responsible to provide comprehensive nutritional services in collaboration with the Diabetes Self-Management team incorporating health, wellness, culture and socio-economic content to member First Nations.

Primary Duties and Responsibilities:

- Access Quality Improvements through need, promotion and implementation of culturally appropriate community-based programs and activities.
- Assess and provide client-centered nutritional counseling through one-on-one and/or group sessions.
- Co-facilitate diabetes education sessions in group or individual settings through collaboration with the Diabetes Self-Management Team Lead.
- Develop client-centered nutritional care plans through clinical setting or home visits.
- Provide nutritional education to clients with unique health conditions.

Qualifications:

- University degree in dietetics or nutritionist from a recognized University
- Completion of a Dietitians of Canada accredited dietetic internship or Master's degree with demonstrated competencies
- Eligibility for a membership in the College of Dietitians of Ontario and Dietitians of Canada
- Must be a Certified Diabetes Educator designated by the Canadian Diabetes Educators Certification Board or be eligible to write and successfully pass the Certification exam.
- Must have proven ability to work within a team environment.
- Must possess excellent interpersonal and communication skills
- Knowledge of Anishnawbek culture and holistic health needs, an asset
- A clear criminal reference check is a condition of employment
- Must have a valid driver's license
- Must be able to work with minimal supervision and within flexible work hours.
- Given the traditional practices of Aboriginal peoples, from time to time, exposure to smoke in a ventilated room from the burning of sacred medicines, tobacco, sage, cedar and sweet grass, may occur.
